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Course Description:

Introduction to research techniques in a college library using specialized research databases. Learn use of subject databases that emphasize full-text materials on discipline-specific topics such as literature, pro-con issues, and gender topics. Practice MLA /APA citation formats for articles from these databases.

Course Requirements and Student Responsibilities:

- 1. Attendance is mandatory. No make-up days will be allowed.
- 2. Students must be willing to do independent and group projects.
- 3. Students will complete and turn in hands-on exercises at the end of each class.
- 4. You will receive credit for your work after you have successfully completed the hands-on exercises, homework, and the final project.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course students should be able to:

- 1. Research a given topic and select appropriate articles.
- 2. Search Las Positas College research databases to find periodical articles in journals, newspapers or magazines as well as other research materials.
- 3. Formulate effective research strategies for locating magazine, journal, and newspaper articles as well as other research materials on a selected topic in LPC discipline-specific databases.
- 4. Distinguish between popular magazines and peer-reviewed journals.
- 5. Document sources by creating a works-cited list based on APA and MLA guidelines in NoodleBib, a citation-generating tool. Citing your sources helps you avoid plagiarism by giving credit to the sources you used. Student Learning Outcomes:

Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) are statements describing knowledge, skills, abilities, and attitudes that a student will be able to demonstrate at the end (or as a result) of his or her completion of a particular assignment, course, or program.

- 1. Students will develop and refine search strategies to locate appropriate information sources using the special research databases for an approved topic.
- 2. Students will create MLA and APA bibliographies from the appropriate information sources.

Classroom Behavior:
